



MENTOR - MENTORING BETWEEN TEACHERS IN SECONDARY AND HIGH SCHOOLS

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PRACTICAL TIPS: ROLE - PLAYING.

Get your students to work in pairs/groups and act out role plays:

- □ Teaches students real communication rules;
- □ They take on different roles, put themselves in another person's position;
- ☐ They look at actions from a different point of view, a different perspective;
- ☐ They take turns to talk and listen;
- □ They become more objective;
- ☐ They learn SELF-RESPECT and RESPECT.





Have your students track or observe incidents of conflicts they have witnessed or been personally involved in.

- Students keep a conflict journal;
- ☐ They write down the incidents, the facts, not the names of the students involved;
- ☐ They describe each person's reactions;
- ☐ They evaluate each person's reactions, positive/negative;
- □ They report how the conflict ended
- ☐ They suggest their own resolution, if they wish.

PRACTICAL TIPS: TRACKING/OBSERVING.









PRACTICAL TIPS: LISTENING .

Many conflicts start because of misunderstandings and miscommunication. Teaching students good listening habits can be an important tool.

Teach students the power of careful listening. Teach them how to listen:

- □ Look directly at the speaker and make eye contact;
- Let the speaker talk without interruption;
- ☐ Ask questions;
- Do not give advice or offer suggestions;
- Give the speaker positive reinforcement by nodding or smiling;
- □ Repeat what you have heard in your own words.



When there is a conflict in class, get the students involved to sit down and write about it.

- ☐ It serves as a time-out, a cooling-off period;
- ☐ It helps them reflect on the incident;
- ☐ They write about their feelings;
- ☐ They write about their reactions;
- □ Ask them to write 3 things they would have done differently;
- ☐ They learn from their mistakes.
